

At the meeting of the Shiawassee County Board of Commissioners held on Wednesday, January 15, 2025 in the Commissioner Chambers, Surbeck Building, Corunna, Michigan:

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Brodeur at 5:00 p.m.

Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Invocation was offered by Commissioner Haley.

Roll call found Commissioners Haley, Holzhausen, Johnson, Garber, Shepard and Chairman Brodeur present. Commissioner Howard arrived at 5:02 p.m.

It was moved by Commissioner Garber, seconded by Commissioner Holzhausen to approve the agenda as presented. Motion carried.

It was moved by Commissioner Garber, seconded by Commissioner Holzhausen to approve the minutes of the December 11, 2024 Board of Commissioners meeting. Motion carried.

It was moved by Commissioner Johnson, seconded by Commissioner Haley to approve the minutes of the January 8, 2025 Organizational meeting. Motion carried.

RESOLUTION #: 25-01-01

RE: Wheeler Intercounty Drain Bonds, Series 2025

WHEREAS, proceedings have been taken by the Drainage Board for the Wheeler Intercounty Drain for improvements to the Wheeler Intercounty Drain (the "Project") pursuant to a petition filed with the Genesee County Drain Commissioner under the provisions of Chapter 8 of the Drain Code of 1956, as amended (the "Drain Code"); and

WHEREAS, in order to defray the cost of the Project, the Drainage Board has authorized and provided for the issuance by the Wheeler Intercounty Drain Drainage District (the "Drainage District") of bonds (the "Bonds") in the aggregate principal amount of not to exceed \$920,000, bearing interest at a rate not to exceed 6% per annum, and maturing not later than June 1, 2045, in anticipation of the collection of an equal amount of special assessments against property and public corporations (including the County of Shiawassee) in the Counties of Genesee and Shiawassee in the Drainage District, said special assessments having been duly confirmed as provided in the Drain Code; and

WHEREAS, the Computation of Cost for the Project sets forth an estimated cost of \$920,000, to be allocated among the County of Genesee and the County of Shiawassee as hereinafter provided; and

WHEREAS, 86% of the cost of the Project has been apportioned by the Drainage Board to the County of Genesee and 14% of the cost of the Project has been apportioned by the Drainage Board to the County of Shiawassee; and

WHEREAS, the Drainage Board deems it advisable and necessary to obtain from this Board a resolution consenting to the pledge of the limited tax full faith and credit of the County of Shiawassee on the Bonds to the extent of special assessments assessed against property and public corporations in the County of Shiawassee; and

WHEREAS, the Project is necessary to protect and preserve the public health and it is in the best interest of the County of Shiawassee that the Bonds be sold.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF SHIAWASSEE:

1. Pursuant to the authorization provided in Sections 132 and 276 of the Drain Code, the Shiawassee County Board of Commissioners, by a majority vote of its members elect, does hereby irrevocably pledge the limited tax full faith and credit of the County of Shiawassee for the prompt payment of the principal of and interest on the Bonds to the extent of special assessments against property and public corporations in the County of Shiawassee, and does agree that in the event that property owners or public corporations in the County of Shiawassee shall fail or neglect to account to the Shiawassee County Treasurer for the amount of any such special assessment installment and interest (in anticipation of which the Bonds are issued) when due, then the amount thereof shall be immediately advanced from County of Shiawassee funds, and the Shiawassee County Treasurer is directed to immediately make such advancement to the extent necessary. The ability of the County of Shiawassee to levy taxes to pay its share of the principal of and interest on the Bonds shall be subject to constitutional and statutory limitations on the taxing power of the County.

2. In the event that, pursuant to said pledge of full faith and credit, the County of Shiawassee advances out of County funds, any part of the principal of and interest due on the Bonds, it shall be the duty of the Shiawassee County Treasurer, for and on behalf of the County of Shiawassee, to take all actions and proceedings and pursue all remedies permitted or authorized by law for the reimbursement of such sums so paid.

3. The Shiawassee County Treasurer is hereby authorized, if necessary, to execute a certificate of the County of Shiawassee to comply with the continuing disclosure undertaking of the County of Shiawassee with respect to the Bonds pursuant to paragraph (b)(5) of SEC Rule 15c2-12 issued under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, as amended, and amendments to such certificate from time to time in accordance with the terms of such certificate (the certificate and any amendments thereto are collectively referred to herein as the "Continuing Disclosure Certificate"). The County of Shiawassee hereby covenants and agrees that it will comply with and carry out all of the provisions of the Continuing Disclosure Certificate, to do all other things necessary for compliance with Rule 15c2-12 issued under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, as amended, and to do all other things that are necessary to effectuate the sale and delivery of the Bonds.

4. This resolution shall become effective only if the Board of Commissioners of the County of Genesee adopts a resolution substantially in the form of this resolution that pledges the limited tax full faith and credit of the County of Genesee to the payment of the principal of and interest on the Bonds when due to the extent of its apportioned share of the cost of the Project.

5. All resolutions and part of resolutions, insofar as the same may be in conflict with the provisions of this resolution, are hereby rescinded.
