

Shiawassee County Contact Information for Tenants

Below are service providers participating with the 66th District Court as a resource for qualified tenants attempting to avoid eviction.

Please note that the 66th District Court cannot provide legal advice.

Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS): (989) 725-3200

The Michigan Department of Health and Human Services provides assistance in paying rent, deposits, or relocating individuals who qualify for its services. To determine your eligibility, call and ask to speak with a Housing Specialist.

Catholic Charities: (989) 723-8239

Catholic Charities can provide financial resources for residents of Shiawassee County who are at risk of being evicted. Housing programs, including the Covid Emergency Rental Assistance (CERA) program, are initiated by an initial phone call or by a referral for an in-person meeting. Assistance is determined on a case-by-case basis.

Legal Services of South Central Michigan (LSSCM): (517) 394-2985

Depending on your circumstances and its eligibility criteria, LSSCM can provide legal advice and in some cases even representation by an attorney to individuals facing eviction. LSSCM can be contacted at the above telephone number Monday through Friday between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., although you may have to leave a voice mail message. LSSCM can also advise you and refer you to other available resources. Calling within 48 hours of your receipt of this notice will maximize LSSCM's ability to respond to your call and consider your situation for possible representation. You should have available all of the documents related to your Landlord-Tenant matter at the time of your call.
